

Dear Brisbane City Council,

I would like to formally object to this proposed development in Hawkesbury Road Moggill. My objection is based primarily on the significant environmental impacts the development is likely to cause, particularly the destruction of native wildlife habitat and the increased pressure on already congested local roads and infrastructure.

The Hawkesbury Rd and wider Moggill contains important bushland and habitat corridors that support native wildlife species, including , reptiles , marsupials and other fauna native to the region. Clearing vegetation and urbanising these uplands areas will result in habitat fragmentation, displacement of wildlife, and increased mortality from traffic, domestic animals and human activity. Once these natural corridors are destroyed they cannot be easily restored.

This area also plays an important role in maintaining local biodiversity and ecological balance . Development in environmentally sensitive areas undermines the long term environmental sustainability of the region and conflicts with community expectations to preserve green space and native habitat.

In addition Hawkesbury Rd and surrounding roads are already under traffic pressure. Additional residential or commercial development will place further strain on local infrastructure increasing congestion , travel times, road safety risks and noise pollution for existing residents. The road network in Moggill is limited and with few alternative access routes , and further population growth without significant infrastructure upgrades will negatively affect the quality of life for current residents.

I also request that council carefully consider

- 1 -the cumulative environmental impact of ongoing development in the Moggill area.
- 2 -The adequacy of wildlife and vegetation assessments for this proposal.
- 3 -Flooding stormwater runoff and erosion risks associated with clearing upland vegetation .
- 4 -The long term impact on community amenity and character.

I urge council to reject this proposal.
